

Important Information About Your Drinking Water Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Del City (OK1020805)

Our water system violated a drinking water standard over the past year. Even though this was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happen and what we did to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the month of November 2007, we did not monitor or did not complete all monitoring for (T.O.C.) and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

However, over the past three years, we have not experienced a violation due to TOC removal, and had no violations due to disinfection byproducts such as TTHM's and/or HAA5's.

What should I do? There is nothing you need to-do at this time.

The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year, how often we are supposed to sample this contaminant and how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

What happen? Samples not taken for the month of November 2007.

What is being done? We have added all samplings to our computerized work order system that will automatically generate a work order for sampling events such as those needed to comply with the Disinfection Byproduct Rule.
